




Ladybird We have had fun in class this week exploring Chinese New Year. We have looked at lots of different resources linked to Chinese New Year and created a new investigation table including chopsticks, red envelopes, dragon and lots of examples of Chinese characters. The children have tried copying their own Chinese characters using black ink on lucky red paper. We watched a video

about how people celebrate Chinese New Year with Dragon dancing and loud drums. Then, in the hall, we were able to recreate this ourselves! In our class lots of the children have enjoyed making their own little dragons which look very effective.

In the video that we watched, we saw a variety of food that people eat when celebrating Chinese New Year and I asked the children if they would like to try some. One of the children said they would not like to eat the lobster!! Instead of lobster, we ate noodles, rice, prawn crackers, and different flavour sauces. Some of the children were keen to try using the chopsticks as they had seen the people do on the video and this was very tricky but they persevered. Out in the garden we had lots of noodles in a tray and used chopsticks to pick these up too.



Finally we read a story called Cleversticks about a little boy who is sad that he can't do lots of things at school, but very good at using chopsticks. This story is on "Youtube" if you would like to access it with your child this weekend.
